ARGENTINA

Argentina continues to make significant strides in **school sports**, reinforcing its commitment to youth athletic development and international collaboration.

A key achievement took place in **Bahrain**, where the **Argentine School Sports Federation** formalized a **Friendship Agreement** with **Chile, the Dominican Republic, Brazil, and Mexico**, all members of the **International School Sport Federation (ISF)**. This alliance strengthens ties between nations and expands opportunities for student-athletes across the region.

Furthermore, the **Argentine Federation of School Sports**, in collaboration with the **AFA Professional Football League** and the **Argentine Footballers' Union (FAA)**, remains dedicated to promoting school sports as the starting point for young athletes. Emphasizing the idea that **"the journey of an athlete begins in school"**, Argentina continues to merge **sports and education** as a pathway for growth.

Through these initiatives, Argentina reaffirms its **commitment to fostering school sports and strengthening international cooperation in 2025.**



BRAZIL

Brazil is starting 2025 with great energy, emphasizing the importance of youth sports development through a series of initiatives aimed at fostering talent and enhancing competitive opportunities. The country is actively organizing internal selection events to identify top young athletes for upcoming national and international competitions. This follows the outstanding success of the Brazilian School Games (JEBS) 2024, where more than 5,452 athletes participated across a wide range of sports, highlighting the depth and diversity of talent among Brazil's youth athletes.

One of the key events that took place to kick off the year was the International School Sport Seminar in Curitiba, where several members of ISF America participated. This seminar was an important platform for knowledge exchange, discussing new strategies for enhancing school sports programs and fostering collaboration across different countries. The event emphasized the importance of building strong relationships within the global school sports community and improving the quality of sports education and competition for young athletes worldwide.

The internal selection events that Brazil is organizing play a crucial role in maintaining the country's strong presence in international school sports. These selections allow athletes to refine their skills, gain invaluable competitive experience, and prepare to represent Brazil on the global stage in future competitions.

CHILE

Chile is gearing up for an even more active **2025**, with **El Deporte Escolar del Club Deportivo Universidad Católica** continuing its mission to strengthen school sports, particularly in the provinces.

While primarily based in **Santiago**, the club has been expanding its reach since **2023**, organizing **16 padel tournaments** in different cities. In **2024**, the expansion continued with:

- **16 padel tournaments**
- **3 basketball 3x3 tournaments**
- **2 cross-country events**
- **1 Futbolito (small-sided football) tournament**
- **1 beach volleyball tournament**

With these growing initiatives, **2025 promises to be a year of even greater opportunities**, ensuring that more young athletes across Chile can participate in competitive sports and develop their talents. The goal remains clear: **to strengthen school sports nationwide and create a lasting impact beyond the capital.**

COLOMBIA

Last year, Colombia hosted the XXVIII South American School Games, bringing together over 2,000 athletes and coaches from 10 countries. With an investment of 14 billion pesos, the event showcased Colombia's potential to host major international multi-sport competitions. The Colombian delegation, made up of 176 athletes from across the country, delivered an outstanding performance, winning numerous medals through dedication and hard work.

Additionally, during the XVII General Assembly of the Central American and Caribbean Sports Council (CONCECADE) in Washington, Colombia was unanimously selected to host the VII Central American and Caribbean School Games in 2025. The announcement took place at the American Sports Summit, where regional sports leaders gathered to strengthen cooperation.

Minister of Sport Patricia Duque Cruz will lead the event, which has the full support of 24 participating nations, further solidifying Colombia's role in the development of school sports in the region.





CUBA

Following the successful 60th edition in 2024, Cuba is preparing for the 61st National School Sports Games in 2025, reinforcing its dedication to youth sports development.

This prestigious event, considered the most important in the country's school sports movement, includes competitions in the Pioneril (11-12 years old), Escolar (13-14 / 15-16 years old), and Juvenil (17-18 years old) categories. Additionally, athletes with disabilities compete under the same conditions, promoting inclusivity in sports.

In 2025, Cuba will continue working on its national events, providing a platform for growth not only for athletes but also for coaches, referees, and sports officials. Through training programs and scientific exchanges, these events serve as a space for continuous improvement, ensuring Cuba remains a reference in school sports development.





MEXICO

After a standout 2024, where Mexico successfully hosted the National Gymnasiade, bringing together 3,856 participants in sports like Chess, Athletics, Baseball, Fencing, Football, Karate, Swimming, and Taekwondo, the country remains committed to developing its school sports sector in 2025.

This year, Mexico has already taken important steps by conducting two certifications for physical education teachers, one in January and another in March, in collaboration with the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM), the country's most prestigious university. These certifications aim to enhance the quality of sports education and training nationwide.

Another major highlight of 2025 is the international collaboration between the Mexican School Sport Federation (FEMEDEES) and the Chinese Taipei School Sport Federation (CTSSF). In March, José Martín Sánchez Tenorio, President of FEMEDEES, and Chien-Feng Hu, President of CTSSF, signed an MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) to create more opportunities for athletes from both countries, fostering global sports development and exchange.

With these initiatives, Mexico continues to strengthen its school sports programs, ensuring better preparation for young athletes and expanding international opportunities in the world of student sports.





PARAGUAY

Paraguay remains committed to the development of sports and education, actively working on initiatives that promote physical activity and school sports.

On March 18, 2025, Paraguay hosted its First National Seminar on Physical Activity and Sports, a milestone event focused on improving sports infrastructure and encouraging a healthy, active lifestyle for all. The seminar brought together experts and educators to discuss strategies for advancing physical education in the country.

Looking ahead, on April 19, 2025, Paraguay will celebrate the Juegos Escolares y Estudiantiles Nacionales (JEEN) 2025, one of the most important events in its school sports calendar.

This year, the competition will emphasize inclusivity with the introduction of a new Paralympic sport, reinforcing the country's commitment to providing equal opportunities for all young athletes.

With these initiatives, Paraguay continues to strengthen its national sports programs, ensuring greater participation and development for future generations.





PUERTO RICO

This year, the International School Sport Federation (ISF) welcomes Freddie Sánchez Guardiola back to the organization. As the representative of ISF in Puerto Rico and President of Propulsores del Deporte, Sánchez Guardiola continues to play a key role in promoting school sports on the island. His leadership and dedication to youth sports development align with ISF's mission to foster international cooperation and encourage young athletes' participation in sports. Through his efforts, Puerto Rico's collaboration with ISF continues to grow, reinforcing its commitment to athletic excellence and educational development for young athletes.

As part of his ongoing work, the President of ISF Puerto Rico also visited Mexico, where he presented the country's Master Sports Plan to Martín Sánchez Tenorio, President of ISF America and FEMEDEES Mexico. This meeting aimed to strengthen ties between ISF member nations, facilitating the exchange of strategies and best practices to enhance school sports programs across the region.





REPUBLICA DOMINICANA

The Dominican Republic continues to expand its commitment to sports and education through key initiatives in 2025 and 2026.

The Escuela Abierta y Activa Program is making a significant impact, with 172 educational centers involved and over 79,740 students expected to participate by 2025. Additionally, 2,440 student volunteers are serving as leaders, and 384 teachers have been trained to support the program, ensuring a strong foundation for school sports development.

From July 26 to August 2, 2025, San Francisco de Macorís will host the XI National School Games, bringing together student-athletes from across the country to compete in 19 sports. This national event plays a crucial role in fostering young athletic talent.

Looking ahead, the Dominican Republic is also preparing for the XXV Central American and Caribbean Games in 2026, where 6,000 athletes will compete. The country is already working on sports infrastructure renovations and event planning to position itself as a top regional sports hub.

With these initiatives, the Dominican Republic continues to strengthen its school sports programs and reinforce its role as a major host for international competitions.





UNITED STATES OF AMERICA

The **Amateur Athletic Union (AAU)** has started 2025 with great momentum, actively organizing multiple internal events that highlight its commitment to youth sports development. Among the many events already underway are:

- **AAU Boys Basketball World Championship 2025:** This tournament will take place July 3–6, 2025, at ESPN Wide World of Sports in Orlando, Florida.
AAU Junior Olympic Games 2025: The event will take place in Houston, Texas, from July 23 to August 2, 2025. This 59th edition will feature new competitions like Flag Football and 7v7 Soccer. Over 15,000 young athletes and 40,000 spectators are expected.
- **AAU Volleyball Classic 2025**
Scheduled for March 29-30, 2025, at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando, Florida. This tournament is a key preparation event for youth volleyball teams ahead of national championships.
These are just a few examples of the many events AAU is organizing this year, reinforcing its mission to provide **"Sports for All, Forever"** while strengthening youth development and international cooperation in sports.





AAU Hosts ISF America President to Strengthen Sports Collaboration for the Growth of the Americas

On December 5, 2025, the President of ISF America visited the AAU headquarters in Florida, where he met with AAU President Jo Mirza. The meeting focused on the importance of working together to promote the shared mission of "Sports for All, Forever!" and to foster sports development across the Americas.

Both parties agreed to strengthen cooperation, aiming to expand access to sports, encourage international partnerships, and create new opportunities for athletes. This collaboration is key to supporting the growth of sports in the Americas and ensuring a more inclusive, connected future for athletes of all backgrounds.








