The ISF World School Championship (WSC) is a competition exclusively dedicated to school teams. In the year of the WSC, the International School Sport Federation (ISF) is required to organize a minimum of six events. This structure is designed to enhance the level of competition, encourage broader participation across different sports, and maintain a strong and consistent organizational framework throughout the WSC year.

Football, basketball, volleyball, handball, futsal will be organized separately for U18 and U15 age categories.

Other sports will combine both U18 and U15 categories within the same event → enabling bigger participation & interaction among age groups.



ISF WSC EVENTS

Scheduling of ISF World School Championship (WSC) Events

- The schedule of ISF World School Championship (WSC) events will follow a structure of **odd and even years**, making it **easier for members to plan** seasons, selections and budgets.
- In years with an ISF Summer Gymnasiade, sports on the Gymnasiade programme will not be organised as separate WSC events, so hosts and members can focus resources on one flagship event.
- ISF will **publish its official event calendar several years ahead**, giving members and hosts enough time to prepare, secure support and build participation.

This structure **improves organisational efficiency**, strengthens member engagement, and increases the visibility and impact of ISF competitions worldwide.

ISF SUMMER GYMNASIDE

Selection of Sports by the Host Country

This structure is designed to enhance the level of competition, encourage broader participation across different sports, and maintain a strong and consistent organizational framework throughout the WSC year.

Minimum Sports

To be chosen from the mandatory list of certified ISF sports

The host country is best positioned to determine which sports they can organize and deliver at the highest possible level.

Para Sports

The list must also include at least 2 Para sports in the final selection

Ensure that inclusivity, solidarity and excellence lie at the core of all ISF events.
No student is left behind.

Mandatory Core Sports in Every Gymnasiade

Athletics, Swimming, and Gymnastics (Artistic and Rhythmic).

This ensures consistency and upholds the traditional values of the Gymnasiade.

Celebrates the half century old legacy of the ISF Gymnasiade and ensures key sports continue to lend flavour to the Gymnasiade.

The Gymnasiade is a competition for selected national school teams and individual athletes, providing a unique platform to showcase the world's best young talents in school sport.



ISF WINTER GYMNASIADE

The ISF Winter Gymnasiade is a multi-sport international school competition organized for both U18 and U15 categories, promoting winter sports among school-aged athletes from around the world.

The core sports in the ISF winter program may include:

- Alpine Skiing
- Skating
- Biathlon
- Ice Hockey
- Curling
- Cross-Country
- Skiing
- Snowboarding



Hosts can add extra sports that fit their local traditions, infrastructure and expertise, with a focus on **snow and/or ice disciplines**.

The organization of the ISF Winter Gymnasiade provides unique opportunities for young athletes to experience international competition in a high-level sporting environment. It promotes inclusivity, cultural exchange, and the development of winter sports in school sport systems worldwide.

Expands the ISF calendar into snow and ice disciplines, opening new pathways for participation in countries **where these disciplines are less accessible**.



ISF WORLD CUP

ISF World Cup Format – Elevating Standards through National Team Competitions

The **ISF World Cup** lets host countries organise events in **any sport**, with participation based on **national school teams**, not individual schools. This gives hosts **more flexibility** while keeping a clear, elite competition format.

By bringing national school teams, the World Cup delivers top-level competitions, helps countries showcase their best young talents, and **raises the profile of school sport internationally**.

For members and hosts, it's a **stronger, more prestigious product**:


- stronger competitive value

ISF SCHOOL SPORT FESTIVAL

Sports, Fun & Family Time

- A **summer multi-sport festival open to everyone**, with a special **focus on families and young athletes**. Students compete, while parents enjoy a relaxed holiday atmosphere.
- **Flexible packages** for accommodation, transport and meals let families choose what fits their **budget and travel style**—from a weekend stay to a full vacation.
- The programme mixes **youth competitions** with water parks, outdoor adventures, evening entertainment, cultural visits and workshops, keeping the whole family engaged.
- The festival is a **turn-key product** that ISF Members can initiate and host, helping them:
 - attract more schools and families into their network
 - develop local tourism and partnerships
 - strengthen their role as leaders of school sport in their country.





ISF ACADEMY

Reforming the ISF Academy for Greater Impact

We are reshaping ISF Academy into a more dynamic, participant-focused and financially sustainable platform for school sport education. The end goal is our members, school students worldwide and PE teachers benefit.


- **Lower costs:**
 - HoDs, ISF coaches diploma holder do not need to pay Academy fees again.
 - General Academy fees will be reduced in the future.
- **Innovation and opportunity:**
 - The current model does not fully align with member expectations or student interests. By redesigning the Academy
 - **New International Federation programmes** to help members train PE teachers and school coaches in their own countries.
 - Introduce sponsor-supported programs—including new opportunities to train and develop PE teachers—we can deliver stronger value and strengthen ISF's global educational impact
 - Before only event hosts could run workshops, today ensure the grassroot level PE teachers are equipped to give your regions students the best chance at succeeding in sport.
- **Stronger events:** Education will be built into ISF events—workshops, clinics and exchanges—making participation more attractive for students and staff.



REGISTRATION SYSTEM

Modernizing the ISF Registration and Data Management System

- Invest in a streamlined, future-ready platform to improve efficiency, reduce errors, and provide a more professional experience for all stakeholders in school sports worldwide.
- Develop a new, modern, user-friendly registration system that simplifies the process for national federations, schools, and event organizers.
- The new system should go beyond registration by including:
 - Integrated results management
 - Real-time data tracking
 - Comprehensive data collection adhering to legal regulations.
- Accurate and accessible data is crucial for:
 - Better decision-making
 - Enhanced event operations
 - Stronger athlete development tracking
 - More effective communication with members and partners.
- Address the limitations of the current ERAS platform, which no longer meets the evolving needs of a modern, dynamic international federation.





LICENCE FEE

License Fee Policy and Event Distribution

- Adjust license fees based on:
 - Popularity of each sport
 - Expected participation levels
- Reduced fees for sports with lower participation or limited reach, encouraging more countries to host ISF events.
- Strategic attention to geographical distribution of events to ensure:
 - Balanced representation across all continents
 - Inclusivity and global development.
- Smaller ISF events will continue to play a crucial role in:
 - Expanding the network of host countries
 - Strengthening local capacity
 - Building new partnerships
 - Broadening the global footprint.
- Reduce financial pressure on Local Organising Committees while focusing more on:
 - Communication
 - Visibility
- Invest in long-term value and sustainable growth for all stakeholders.

LOC PARTNERSHIP

Strengthening ISF–LOC Partnership Through Event License Fee Reinvestment

To build a stronger and more supportive partnership between the ISF and Local Organizing Committees (LOC), it is essential that the Event License Fee collected by the ISF is partially reinvested into the event itself. This approach reflects ISF’s commitment to the success of each event and its recognition of the crucial role played by the LOC. The vision is to eventually **reinvest** some of the License Fee and ISF surplus to key areas such as:

- Event communication, promotion and branding
- ERAS support (Event Registration and Accreditation System)
- ISF Solidarity initiatives
- Boarding and lodging support aligned with the scale of the event

By contributing to these essential elements, ISF actively supports the LOC and helps raise the overall quality and visibility of the event. Further we aim to increase the daily **participation fee to support LOCs in organizing better events more easily.** Additionally, once the License Fee is paid, the host country is exempt from paying the ISF levy for its own participants, reducing the financial burden on the host and allowing more focus on delivering a world-class event.

This model ensures a fair and collaborative framework that fosters long-term trust and cooperation between the ISF and host countries.



ISF GOVERNANCE

Ensuring Efficiency Through Clear Roles in ISF Governance

To build a better and more efficient ISF structure, it is essential to avoid assigning double roles within ISF bodies. By clearly defining and separating responsibilities, we can eliminate confusion during events and ensure that every individual is fully focused on their specific role. This approach will strengthen coordination, improve performance, and support the overall success of ISF activities.





ISF MEMBERS

Strengthening ISF Membership and Governance

ISF Members are the greatest strength of our organization. To ensure their continued growth and effectiveness, it is important that they are supported not only by ISF but also by their respective governments. We will work closer to understand our member needs and support them with stronger communication and recognition.

To address challenges with inactive members, a clear follow-up process will be implemented:

- If a member does not participate in three consecutive General Assemblies without providing reasonable explanation, a formal review procedure will be initiated. This process will be conducted diplomatically, aiming to resolve the issue constructively while maintaining strong relationships.
- Continued inactivity may result in membership termination, allowing new, active organizations to apply.

ISF will also prioritize collaboration with recognized organizations that actively support ISF and contribute to strong participation at events. To protect the structure of ISF membership:

- Direct applications from participants, schools, or organizations must be approved by the corresponding ISF Member.
- Full members must correspond to recognized countries (aligned with the UN list). Regional bodies may be accepted as Associate Members, with one collective vote in General Assembly matters.

By implementing these measures, ISF will protect membership integrity, strengthen the global network, and ensure that all members are properly represented and valued.



ISF MUCH MORE THAN SPORT

Expanding Cooperation and Partnerships

ISF is not only a sports organization but also a platform for cultural exchange and education. To fully reflect this mission, we must strengthen our cooperation with international federations and global NGOs such as UNESCO, UNICEF, and others. These partnerships will help us promote values like inclusion, education, health, and cultural understanding, while giving ISF a stronger international presence.

By working closely with these organizations, ISF can develop joint programs, expand educational initiatives, and deliver projects that benefit young people worldwide. This approach reinforces ISF's role as a leader in school sport, connecting athletic excellence with meaningful cultural and educational impact.



ISF SPONSORSHIP

Developing a Stronger ISF Sponsorship Strategy

Sponsors ask: “What are the benefits?”

- ISF’s visibility needs improvement. A thorough evaluation is needed to build a stronger foundation for sponsorship growth.

Long-term planning is key:

- A two-year event calendar allows sponsors to plan and maximize exposure.
- Actions to increase visibility and sponsorship value:
 - Conduct a visibility audit (website, social media, media).
 - Create a two-year event calendar with clear dates, locations, and expected audiences.
 - Develop tailored sponsorship packages (global, regional, event-specific).
 - Communicate the value of ISF’s network clearly.
 - Reinforce LOC and member benefits to encourage their support.
 - Allow local sponsorships where there’s no conflict.
 - Increase awareness within the sports marketing industry.



Leverage the ISF network:

- ISF’s broad LOC and member network should be integrated into sponsorship packages for mutual benefit.
- Develop a transparent sponsorship strategy:
 - The strategy should be approved by members.
 - Reinvest a portion of funds into network strengthening, visibility, and member support, boosting long-term sponsor relationships.



ISF BROADCASTING

Developing broadcasting

- Unlock a major revenue stream through media rights, live coverage, and digital content.
- Increase ISF visibility and global reach by showcasing events to a wider international audience.
- Promote athletes and member countries, strengthening the value and prestige of ISF competitions.
- Enhance sponsor appeal with broader exposure and higher engagement.
- Build ISF's brand identity through consistent, high-quality production and storytelling.

Broadcasting is a strategic investment that can significantly boost ISF income and elevate the organization's international notoriety.

Professionalized Content Creation: Build a small ISF media team dedicated to:

- Fast social media content during events (Instagram, TikTok, LinkedIn, Facebook, YouTube Shorts)
- High-quality visuals: photos, video highlights, athlete interviews
- Behind-the-scenes storytelling to humanize athletes and events
- Launch the ISF Podcast series with a range of ambassadors, athletes, and institutional partners.

Launch new ISF Website

- A modern, constantly updated website that showcases events, rankings, stories and education – the primary reference point for schools, partners and media.

Stronger Event Branding

- Enhance ISF brand presence at all events through consistent signage, backdrops, flags, banners, and athlete uniforms.

Two-Year Communication Calendar

- Plan communications at least two years in advance, aligned with the confirmed event calendar.
- Integrate key campaigns, sponsor visibility moments, and regular updates between events to sustain audience engagement.

Strategic Impact: By combining ambassadors, influencer partnerships, professional content production, stronger branding, and long-term planning, ISF will significantly improve global visibility, strengthen its image, and reinforce its appeal to sponsors and host cities.

Engaging Sport Ambassadors & Influencers

A key strategy is to strengthen ISF's global visibility by involving respected athletes, former champions, and youth influencers who can authentically connect with young audiences.

ISF Sport Ambassadors

- Appoint Olympians, world champions, and recognised role models as official Ambassadors.
- Responsibilities: Promote ISF events on social media, Participate in educational activities and Academy sessions, Represent ISF values (fair play, friendship, respect)
- Select Ambassadors from multiple continents to ensure global reach.

Influencer Collaboration

- Partner with sports influencers, student-athletes, and lifestyle creators with strong youth engagement.
- Invite them to ISF events to produce content (short videos, posts, stories).
- Offer official ISF Influencer status, including event access and branded gear.

- **Qatar** – Took part in an inspiring visit that included strategic discussions on developing school sport in the Middle East.

- **Kenya** – Attended the FEASSA Games in Kakamega, reinforcing ISF’s engagement with the African continent and opening new paths for regional collaboration.

- The **budget** may be adapted once a host is confirmed.
- As the CHF is the functional currency of the ISF since 2024; the Budget will be prepared in CHF for ease of comparison with the ISF accounts.
- **Budget Reduction:** The ISF budget was **reduced by 50%** from **2024 to 2025**, from 4.77 million € to 2.4 million €.
- Once again in **2026** the budget has been **further adjusted down** to 2.1 million CHF, reflecting our ongoing cost management, and focus on financial sustainability.
